

# Fractions from Division Problems

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You will need: journal/paper/whiteboards, pencil/dry erase markers, fraction manipulatives

1. Use the following numbers to write 3 division word problems: 28, 7, 4. You do not need to use all them in each problem.
  - 1 word problem must have a whole number quotient;
  - 1 word problem must have a fraction quotient less than one;
  - 1 word problem must have a quotient that is a mixed number.
2. Represent each problem with manipulatives or a visual model, and an equation
3. Talk with a partner, or write about why each problem results in that type of quotient
4. Replicate this activity with 3 different whole numbers.
